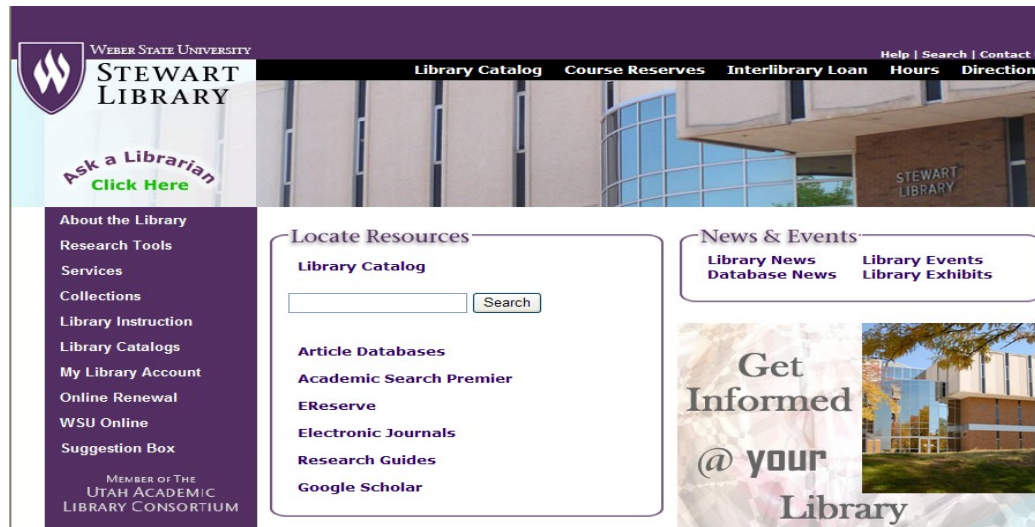

Finding Books

Use the **Library Catalog** to find books, videos, government documents, and other materials.

- ◆ Limit by format or collection (DVDs, videos, electronic books, for example) or by language or publication date.

Finding Articles

Article Databases provide references, abstracts, and sometimes the full-text of articles from journals and other published literature.

- ◆ Find full-text articles from over 40,000 online journals
- ◆ *Academic Search Premier* is a good starting place
- ◆ Use *CQ Researcher* for pro/con topics
- ◆ Off-campus access 24/7 with your WSU user name & password

Interlibrary Loan

- ◆ Request books and articles we don't own

Search Tips

- ◆ Choose several important keywords related to your topic
- ◆ Think of alternate terms or synonyms to improve your search
- ◆ Connect keywords with Boolean operators (AND, OR, NOT)
- ◆ Use the Advanced Search options
- ◆ Enclose phrases in quotation marks, e.g. "gun control" "global warming"

Electronic Journals

- ◆ Use **Electronic Journals** to see if a specific journal or newspaper title is available online

Using Google Scholar

Use **Google Scholar** to search for articles. Start at scholar.google.com. To the right of the search box, click on *Scholar Preferences*. In the *Library Links* box, type in *Weber State*, click *Find Library*, and check boxes for WSU. Click *Save Preferences*. Click on the link *Full-Text@My Library* in your search results. WSU Article Access will pop up. If the article is full text in one of our databases or in our print holdings, you'll see a link to the article (or to the catalog for print holdings). Enter your WSU user name and password when prompted. Be aware **Google Scholar** does NOT cover all of our databases!

Other Google Features

Google offers much more than a search box. Click on *More* at the top of the Google home page to see the many ways you can put Google to use including:

- ◆ Google Books
- ◆ Google Groups
- ◆ Google Documents
- ◆ Google Calendar

Printing in the Library
