






Introduction to the Stewart Library



- 1** The **Search** tool bar provides access to all of the library's search tools.
Use the green search icon to find books, articles, or stream music and videos with **OneSearch**. 
Use the yellow book icon to find materials in the library with the **library catalog**. 
Use the blue disk icon to find journal articles other resources using **databases**. 
- 2** Need help with something? Click **Help** for a list of help options, including telephone, text, email, and chat.
- 3** Check here for an updated list of hours for Stewart and Davis libraries, University Archives, and Special Collections.
- 4** Learn how to navigate the library's resources and services including accessing your account, getting access to course reserves, and using interlibrary loan by clicking on **Using the Library**.
- 5** Have a research question? Click **Chat with a Librarian** to reach a trained research assistant.



Google Scholar



- 1 Use **Google Scholar** to search for articles. Start at scholar.google.com. Click on the three lines in the top, left-hand corner.
- 2 Click on *Settings*.
- 3 On the next screen, click on *Library links*. In the *Library links* box, type in Weber State and check boxes for Weber State University. Click *Save*.

Click on the link *Full-Text@Weber State* in your search results. WSU Article Access will pop up. If the article is full text in one of our databases or in our print holdings, you'll see a link to the article (or to the catalog for print holdings). Enter your WSU user name and password when prompted. Be aware **Google Scholar** does NOT cover all of our databases!



- 2 When the window pops up, click on *LibGuides*.




Information Literacy Requirement **3**

Library and Web searching skills are very important for success in college and for lifelong learning. Information Literacy is a general education requirement at WSU. Students may complete this requirement by registering for and passing one of the seven options listed below. [Click here](#) for more information on the courses.

- **Library Science TD 1704, *The Information Navigator***. One credit hour, this is an online course offered through through WSU Online or as a face-to-face class.

- **Library Science or EDUC 2604, *Information Resources in Education***. One credit hour, this course is designed for education majors and others with a strong interest in education.
- **Library Science or BA 2704, *Information Resources in the Business Disciplines***. One credit hour, this course is designed for business majors and others with a strong interest in business information.
- **Library Science 2804, *Information Resources in the Social Sciences***. One credit hour, this course is designed for students with a strong interest in the social sciences.
- **Library Science or HTHS 2904, *Information Resources in the Health Professions***. One credit hour, this course is designed for students with a strong interest in the health sciences.

Printing: Print documents at the library using cash or Wildcard. B&W copies are five cents per side and color copies are 20 cents per side.

Scanning: Try our bookedge scanner, located next to the reference desk. You can save copies, scan to a USB drive, or email them to yourself directly from the scanner.

Large Format Printing and Scanning: Print posters or scan large size documents on our large format printer and scanner. For details, contact Digital Collections at 801-626-6509.

- **Who** wrote it? (Author/authority)
- **What** sources were used? (References/documentation)
- **When** was it published? (Currency/date)
- **Why** was it published? (Objectivity/purpose/bias)
